Non-School Education of Students: Blooming of Coaching Centres

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CCS RESEARCH INTERNSHIP PAPERS 2004



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Introduction

Education is an important building block for any nation's development. Till a decade back schools were regarded as the basic and main source of imparting education to young minds.

But the late nineties saw the emergence of "parallel schools" in the form of coaching centres, tutors' bureaus and private tutors. Previously considered as something which was taken up only by the so-called "weak students", coaching has now become an integral part of any student's life, even the brightest of them. Taking class XII students as a case study for this project, we take a look at how much money is actually going into this "non-schooling" business in Delhi.

Classification of schools

Schools in Delhi can be classified into three categories namely

- 1> Private and convent schools
- 2> Kendriya Vidyalayas
- 3> Government schools

The classification of these schools is mainly on the basis of their management and the fees charged by them, the second factor reflecting the socio-economic status of the students. We try to find out if any such similar financial classification pattern exists in the coaching centres, too. Thus, we have taken students from three schools, each belonging to a different stratum and tried to trace how much money are they spending on their coaching. We have then tried to draw a comparison between school and non-school expenditure of class XII students on education. The three schools being considered are:

- 1> St. Columbus School (Central Delhi) and St. Anthony School (South Delhi)
- 2> Kendriya Vidyalaya, JNU (South Delhi)
- 3> Government Girls' Senior Secondary School, West Vinod Nagar (East Delhi).

Proximity of coaching centres

To begin with, coaching centres are a localised system of education. Nowadays, blooming of coaching centres has made them easily accessible for everyone. A coaching centre is now a stone's throw away, thus minimising the transportation charges for many students. Students now have a wide variety of coaching options right at their doorstep and only a handful of students who are keen to get their education from a top coaching institute and those who can afford the corresponding expenditure, are the ones who are ready to go that extra mile for coaching.

Types of coaching


Ability to pay for education plays a very important role in the selection of one's mode of coaching. There are three modes of coaching:

- 1> Coaching centres/group tuitions
- 2> Private tutors
- 3> Tutors bureau


While the coaching centres and group tuitions form a sizable portion of the coaching market, private tutors are fast catching up, especially since now the students of top schools prefer private tutors for the personal attention they get from such tutors. The students feel that when there are too many people in class, it becomes very difficult for the teachers to see what each student is doing, and greater the number of students, lesser is the enthusiasm of the teacher to teach properly. This is the main reason why after going to school, the students still have to take the aid of coaching. Students add that, "We study with 50 students in a class in schools and do not understand anything, then why should we go again

to a coaching centre with 50 students in a class and still not get taught properly?" But coaching centres still manage to attract more students as they provide a cheaper option as compared to private tutors. Since a private tutor can charge anything between Rs 100 per hour to Rs 400 per hour, students end up paying a lot more at the end of the year than their classmates who have group tuitions or go to coaching centres. But many students from elite schools, who can afford better education, take help of both coaching centres and private tutors, thus forming the category of students who spend the most on their education. A noteworthy trend here is that while in the case of elite schools, many students go for private tuitions, in government schools, only one student out of 28 is able to afford a private tutor. This can be attributed to the fact that most government school students belong to the lower socio-economic status of the society and hence are deprived of quality education. As a result, most of them are not able to afford the comforts of a private tutor. Given below is the number of students who go to coaching centres, private tutors or both, from the four schools we are considering.






Subject-wise break up of preferred coaching subjects

Science and commerce students constitute the majority of the crowd in the coaching centres. Arts students, due to the theoretical nature of their subjects, do not require coaching as much as their counterparts. As a result, coaching does not help them much as the main aim of coaching is to clarify student's concept and give them a better understanding of the subject. The most popular subjects of coaching are Physics, Chemistry, Maths, Economics and Accounts. However, a separate pattern of coaching is visible among the government school students. Not only do the arts students from these schools take coaching unlike other school students, they also take coaching in a subject like English, which is considered relatively an easy subject by other school students.(Appendix I)



Inter school comparison of spending on coaching

The monthly expenditure on coaching depends upon the mode of coaching- group coaching or private. While the minimum monthly expenditure is more or less same for all categories of schools, the upper limit of spending varies for students belonging to different schools. Here also, students belonging to the first category of schools, namely the elite schools, spend more than double than students from other schools. The only exceptions to this situation are the government schools where the upper limit of spending equals the lower limit of other schools.

Comparison between school fees and coaching fees

In the case of the first category of schools, the school fees are comparable with the coaching fees for most of the students. This can be attributed to the high annual school fees combined with the bus fees and the cost of books. The comparison between school and non-school expenditure of students for the four considered schools is as given below.

Conclusion

As we have seen, the scenario right now is such that a student has to go to two places namely the school and the coaching centre to study the same thing twice. Besides being a waste of time, it also leads to a student spending huge amounts of money on his or her education. The current system defies all logic and raises the question about the validity of such an education system where one has to spend double the money, double the time and double the energy to educate himself or herself. What is also evident is that schools and coaching centres show similar patterns in the financial aspects. The government school students, who due to insufficient finances, are deprived of quality school education, for the same reason have to go to cheaper coaching centres. Also private tutors seem to be out of their reach.

It also forces us to think about the reasons behind this "double education". Everyone concerned is ready to play a blame game. The students believe that incompetent and disinterested teachers are responsible for their thronging coaching centres. The teachers believe that the vast CBSE course and disobedient students are the main cause of the blooming of coaching centres. The solution according to the teachers is to reduce the course content.

Whatever be the reason, it is evident that coaching centres and private tutors are here to stay. Thus, in the future, too, we can expect that the current parallel system of education in terms of schooling and non-schooling will continue to co-exist for a long time to come.
