


In-person Colloquium


Researching Reality Internship 2021 | Compendium


COVID-19 and Women Street Vendors



COVID-19 restrictions beset street vendors with adversities. Particularly hard-hit were women street vendors. To better understand their plight, the Centre for Civil Society interacted with over 80 women street vendors from Delhi and Rajasthan. Our policy brief captures the findings from these conversations and the gendered implications of COVID-19 restrictions. We hosted a Roundtable discussion with over 35 policy experts and influencers to discuss the issue. Our brief was launched by Shri Jadgambika Pal (Lok Sabha MP and Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Urban Development) and Ms Shalini Pandey (Director, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs).


Iqbalunnisa Hussain | Indian Liberals
